The purpose of this award-winning program is to help create a friendlier, safer city and by making connections among the many diverse groups that contribute to Anchorage's current population. Three of our members, Lauren Brion, Merlin Hamre and myself, are now on the Board of Directors of Bridge Builders and most recently Bernt Balchen Lodge Board voted to allow Bridge Builders to hold their board and committee meetings at Viking Hall free of charge as a community service.

Our lodge first became involved with Bridge Builders of Anchorage many years ago when we began sending members to man a Norwegian station at the popular "Meet the World" event at the Anchorage Museum at Rasmuson Center, a celebration of Anchorage's cultural diversity sponsored by Bridge Builders. # FLAT-PLANE CARVING

### Meet Harley Refsal at the "Pig Roast Dinner" August 19

Once again Harley Refsal will be teaching Scandinavian-style flat-plane carving in Anchorage. Harley was a professor of Scandinavian Folk Art and Scandinavian studies at Luther College in Decorah, Iowa retiring just a year ago.

Refsal was born and raised on a farm near Hoffman, Minnesota, homesteaded by his Norwegian-immigrant grandparents.

He began working in wood as a young boy. Primarily self-taught, Harley began winning awards in regional and national carving exhibitions by the late 1970s.

He began researching the history of Scandinavian flat-plane carving where he discovered that most of the artists who had worked in this style during the height of it's popularity, in the early decades of the 20th century, in both Scandinavia and America had died. Flat-plane carving had faded to near-extinction.

Since the 1980s, Harley who speaks fluent Norwegian, has shared his knowledge of, and skills in, Scandinavian flat-plane carving with woodcarvers in classes and presentations in the United States and Scandinavia.

In 1996, Harley was decorated by the King of Norway, receiving the St. Olav's Medal for his contributions to Norwegian folk art.

You can meet and chat with Harley at the "pig roast dinner" on August 19. He still spends 6 weeks in Norway each summer where he teaches the Norwegian language.


