The Scholarships available for members and their families are:

King Olav V Norwegian-American Heritage Scholarship

Its purpose is to fund activities in which the American and Norwegian heritages are explored, studied and shared by qualified scholarship recipients. Awards up to \$2,000. Deadline for submission of completed application is January 15, 2019.

Oslo International Summer School

Scholarship in the amount of \$1,500 is awarded to attend the Oslo International Summer School. Deadline for submission of application is January 15, 2019.

Helen Tronvold Norwegian Folk High School Scholarship

The scholarship objective is to provide cross-cultural experiences for youth to attend one of the many Folk High Schools in Norway. Awards of up to \$3,000. Deadline for application is January 15, 2019.

Helen Tronvold Adult Learner Scholarship

The scholarship objective is to provide cross-cultural experiences for adult Insurance members. Awards of up to \$3,000. Deadline for application is January 15, 2019.

Lund Fund Scholarship

The scholarship is for study abroad experiences through accredited, post high school, educational institutions. Awards of up to \$2,500. Deadline for application is January 15, 2019.

Doug Warne – Rolf & Wenche Eng Scholarship

Scholarship creates an opportunity for qualified applicants to arrend educational institutions in Norway and assists with the costs of tuition, room and board. Awards of up to \$3,000. Deadline for application is January 15, 2019.

Astrid Cates & Myrtle Beinhauer Scholarship

Eligibility: Those who have a certificate of completion from high school and are enrolled in post-secondary training, vocational/trade school or college.

A recipient is selected from each of Districts 1 - 6. Awards are \$1,000. Deadline for application is March 10, 2019.

Nancy Lorraine Jensen Memorial Scholarship

Eligibility: Must be a female who a full-time undergraduate who has completed at least one term of her studies as a major either in chemistry, physics or in chemical, electrical or mechanical engineering. Financial aid is based on need. Deadline for application is April 1, 2019.

Oren & Marie Winjum Scholarship

Scholarship is to assist with college tuition costs for American citizens of Norwegian and/or German heritage. Award is \$2000. Deadline for application is March 10, 2019.

Carl M. Saltveit Scholarship

International Summer School 2019 University of Oslo – Oslo, Norway

The Carl M Saltveit Scholarship Fund will provide tuition, room and board to one qualified applicant to attend the International Summer School at the University of Oslo. Carl

This permanently endowed fund provides one scholarship annually to encourage and facilitate attendance at the International Summer School and pays for Basic Tuition and the cost of room and board in the university dormitory.

Extra classes, optional trips and airfare are the responsibility of the recipient.

The Scholarship is named for Carl M. Saltveit Sr. in honor and remembrance of his contributions to the Norwegian community through Grieg Lodge #15 in Portland, Oregon, his work in Norwegian war relief, educational exchange and services to immigrants and visitors from Norway. He also served as an International Director of the Sons of Norway. Applications (including all supporting documents) must be postmarked no later than January 15th, 2019. YOUTH CAMP INSTRUCTOR/COUNSELOR GRANT APPLICATION FORM

Leif Erikson Lodge 2-001, Sons of Norway, Educational Foundation will award a grant to a person or persons who can provide a positive camp experience for young people participating in the District Two Youth Camp Program.

Instructions to the applicant:

Complete this form in blue or black ink.

To be eligible for the Youth Camp Instructor/Counselor grant, the applicant must be either: 1) a student who is accepted by or attending an accredited college/university in a Scandinavian Studies Program, **OR** 2) a student who is accepted by, or is attending any other college/university program with an interest in Scandinavian heritage and culture, **OR** 3) any member in good standing of Leif Erikson Lodge 2-001, Sons of Norway, who demonstrates a knowledge or interest in Scandinavian heritage and/or culture.

All applicants must supply:

- 1. A current transcript if currently enrolled in school
- A 200-250 word essay describing your accomplishments to date, involvement in community activities and/or in Sons of Norway, why you have an interest in Scandinavia, and educational or career goals
- An application for Camp Instructor/Counselor to a District 2 Youth Program as well as a copy of your application and/or a receipt of your application from the program

A \$500 award is available for each camp. More than one person may receive an award, but the maximum award is \$1,500 per year. All award checks are made out to the school except for applicants who are eligible under option number 3. Preference is given to applicants participating in at least two camps. The award will be sent following successful completion of camp.

 Mail the completed application form to the Leif Erikson Lodge 2-001, Sons of Norway, Educational Foundation address above. To be eligible for consideration, the application must meet <u>all</u> the requirements <u>AND</u> be <u>received</u> by March 29, 2019. The Educational Foundation cannot accept applications by e-mail or fax.

The winners of the Youth Camp Instructor/Counselor grant will be asked to attend Leif Erikson Lodge's September meeting, and comment on his/her instructor/counselor camp experience.

Santa Lucia, or Saint Lucy's Day, is the church feast day dedicated to Saint Lucy and is observed on December 13. Its modern day celebration is generally associated with Sweden, Norway, Denmark and Finland. In traditional celebrations, Saint Lucy or Santa Lucia comes as a young woman with lights and sweets, marking the return of longer daylight to winter darkness. It is one of the few saint days observed in Scandinavia. In some forms, including our program at the lodge, a procession is headed by one girl wearing a crown of candles (or lights), while others follow in the procession with girls holding a single candle and boys holding a star.

The Lucia tradition at the Bernt Balchen Lodge celebrates our Scandinavian heritage through music, food, and language. It is one of the most popular events at the lodge. Children learn and sing Norwegian and Swedish songs, often accompanied by harp and piano. Families are treated to a talent show, singing around the Christmas tree, and enjoying authentic Scandinavian rice pudding, open-faced sandwiches, and desserts. Santa Claus makes a special appearance at this event and hands out goodies to all attending children.
