Thanks to all the volunteers, friends, fans and skiers who participated. We can't wait until next year!










































### SKI FOR LIGHT 2020

The 45th annual Ski for Light (SFL) International week was held February 8-16 in Casper, Wyoming, with the cross-country skiing taking place on nearby Casper Mountain. Local Sons of Norway members attending were Robert Denholm and John and Cynthia Olnes. Summing up the week event chair Judy Dixon wrote, "We certainly did face some challenges with transportation and weather but the Ski for Light spirit was strong."

Ski for Light has long relied on Sons of Norway for volunteers and financial support and has received enthusiastic support from the Sons of Norway leadership. 

### SUPER BOWL PARTY AT VIKING HALL!


Scholarship Fund, Super Bowl Raffle 2020

# Consul's Corner

Information and Opportunities for Norwegian Alaskans



#### **DUAL CITIZENSHIP UPDATE**

As of Monday, February 3, 2020, you may register your application to regain your Norwegian citizenship through the SpN (the Norwegian Directorate of Immigration online application portal). Information and citizenship application can be found at: www.udi.no.

Due to an overwhelming number of online applications from around the world, the website has been crashing and there is no estimate on how long the processing time will be. We have been asked to pass on the following information, "Until further notice, it will not be possible to make an appointment to submit your application and supporting documents at a Norwegian consulate or embassy. This service will be made available as soon as the necessary technical solution permits." When applying to regain your Norwegian Citizenship, you cannot skip any of the required documents including attaching a criminal record certificate from the Norwegian Police. You must first apply for the criminal record certificate before you apply to re-acquire your Norwegian Citizenship.

You can find information about how to apply for a criminal record certificate on the Norwegian Police website (politiet.no). If you live in Norway you can apply for this certificate online. If you live outside of Norway, you must apply by mail.

### STUDYING IN NORWAY?

Foreign Exchange Student to Norway? Folkehøgskole? University Studies in Norway? You no longer need to fly to San Francisco to verify your Student VISA documents. After you have completed all of the required documents for San Francisco (found at www.norway.no), call me for an appointment and we can do the final processing here in Anchorage.

#### PASSPORTS AND PERSONAL NUMBERS?

Norwegian passports and personal numbers can be processed in my office for all children under the age of 12. Older children and adults must travel to a Consulate General Office, Embassy in Washington D.C., or Norway, where there is a biometrics machine, to renew passports. After you have completed all of the required documents for San Francisco (found at www.norway.no), call me for an appointment and we can do the final processing here in Anchorage if you are under the age of 12.

### **ARCTIC CONFERENCES IN NORWAY**

The two main Arctic Conferences in Norway are Arctic Frontiers, held in Tromsø in January (<a href="www.arcticfrontiers.no">www.arcticfrontiers.no</a>), and High North Dialogue, held in Bodø in March (<a href="www.highnorthdialogue.no">www.highnorthdialogue.no</a>). Both are a wonderful opportunity to learn about the Arctic (Norway's #1 foreign policy priority) and hear directly from high level Norwegian Governmental Officials including Prime Minister Erna Solberg.
