TREASURER'S REPORT FOR 2021

As in 2020, covid impacted Bernt Balchen lodge and Viking Hall Inc. in 2021. Fortunately both organizations began the year fiscally sound with sufficient funds in reserve.

If you are new to the lodge please take a look at the enclosed 2022 Calendar of Events. Listed are Sons of Norway Officers and the Viking Hall Board. As with most Sons of Norway lodges that own a building a separate building association is formed to manage and maintain the building - in this case Viking Hall Inc. The Viking Hall Inc. board is comprised of the Bernt Balchen lodge president and treasurer along with six directors, all Sons of Norway members, which serve 3-year terms.

Starting in August event chairs came up with ways to hold traditional events. The Fish Boil was held in mid-August and was well attended. The Faar-i-Kaal dinner was held in September (in-house and takeout) with the Norwegian ambassador in attendance. In early October the indoor/outdoor Nordic Market featured vendors, a café, bake sale, silent auction, book sale, and knitted items. In November the Lutefisk & Meatball dinner was takeout only. The Lucia Family Christmas party was held outdoors at the Abbott Loop Community Park pavilion. These events netted close to \$16,000 in total. The lodge portion of membership dues brought in \$3,990.

The lodge also looked at ways to save money - The Flyer newsletter was mailed out twice, January-February and September-October, while others issues were online-only.

In 2021 the lodge was able to continue its charitable giving. The lodge donated \$250 to the Sons of Norway International foundation and \$400 to Ski for Light as well as awarding two \$1,000 scholarships. Thanks to everyone who supported lodge fundraising efforts—scholarship fund super bowl raffle, silent auction items, and scholarship fund event tips.

As mentioned earlier Viking Hall Inc. has the responsibility of paying all building associated expenses. Rentals provide the bulk of the income to cover these costs. The lodge is fortunate to have a long-term tenant renting a portion of the downstairs. This tenant, Dry Dock, offers space for AA and NA meetings. There were also some upstairs rentals throughout the year. The part-time office position remains unfilled.

Despite the challenges of 2021 Bernt Balchen Lodge and Viking Hall Inc. ended the year on the positive side financially. Thank you to all lodge members who helped make this possible as we move forward in to 2022.

FINANCIAL HEALTH FOR THE COMING YEAR, AND BEYOND

Hello members and friends of Sons of Norway Lodge in Anchorage. I hope you all had a wonderful Christmas and after surviving our early first of the month Chill and high winds that you are off to a good start on a Great New Year.

That doe not mean taking a vacation from doing an update on your Financials, once or twice a year. Just like seeing your doctor for a major health issue, it does not hurt to get a second opinion. I can help you with that at no cost to you, just some time meeting at your house, the lodge or over the telephone. I can even arrange a Zoom meeting if that is what would work best for you.

ATTENTION: PARENTS, GRANDPARENTS, AND GREAT GRAND PARENTS:

You can give your children, grandchildren, or Great Grandchildren a great start to financial security by gifting Viking Voyager Term Life Insurance. It has a very low cost premium, \$50 per year, or you can pay a single premium of \$475 that will cover your loved ones from birth through age 26, with \$25,000 or Coverage. At age 26 your loved one, being a young adult will have to increase their term coverage, or convert to some permanent Life Insurance such as Whole Life. However, having been a member already for a good period of time, they can apply for new coverage without having to take a paramedical exam, even if there have been serious medical issues that have developed during that time.

Dear Ski for Light friends,

Last night the SFL Board of Directors made the difficult decision to cancel our upcoming 2022 International Event in Granby, Colorado, due to changing conditions of the COVID-19 pandemic.

After lengthy discussions with members of the Event Planning Committee, our hosts at Snow Mountain Ranch, our own Dr. Carl Heine and other health advisers, the Board concluded that it would be unsafe to host a large group event at a time when the highly contagious Omicron variant is straining medical facilities across the United States, while disrupting travel and other services for many. One case among our group could quickly snowball into an unmanageable situation for our volunteers. We concluded that the increased uncertainty caused by the Omicron surge heightens the risk for event participants, and that it would not be responsible for our organization to take on those added risk, nor would it be responsible for us to ask participants to take them on.

Ski for Light will issue full refunds of event fees paid to date. Also in the coming weeks, we will be announcing plans for some virtual programming to keep our community active and inspired this winter season.

Thank you for your support for Ski for Light and for your patience and understanding in these trying times.

ALSO FOR SENIORS, AGE 50 UP TO AGE 79 LONG TERM CARE INSURANCE

It is documented that by age 65 most of our population will have had at least one disabling accident or medical disease causing the need for in-home or assisted living, or Nursing home care. These types of events can blitz through your emergency savings (if you have something like that set up), through your retirement saving, and in a worst case scenario, cause a forced sale of your home. Long Term Care Insurance gives you the security that when an event like this comes up you will not have to go through the stress and strain of forced sales, having to live with your kids or relatives because you lost your house. It also assures you that in this type of event you will have insurance to pay for good care, so when your children or relatives come to visit they can do the loving things like take you on walk, or go out to eat, or see a movie, instead of having to do the laundry, vacuum or mop the floor, or other daily chores that you may not be able to do. What this does is protect your estate so it does not get dissolved into a ton of medical care bills that never seem to stop.

I have seen this with both my parents. My dad got very ill before we talked about Long Term care so when he got sick it was too late take out any coverage. With my mom, we were able to get some reasonably good coverage which paid for here to be in assisted living for 36 months, with in 10 days of her death. She paid out \$20,000 in LTCI premiums over a 10 year period. That created a big enough benefit to pay her \$3,000 per month Assisted Living cost for 36 months, a sum of \$108,000. That was in 2007-2010 and I know costs are higher now. Cost is not the issue, securing coverage is, so that you will not have to worry about care or be a burden on you family as you reach your Golden Years.

There are alot of ins and outs to long term care. Give me a call so that we can arrange a time to talk about this. I am happy to meet with you at your residence, at the Lodge, or via Telephone or Zoom meeting if you have a computer to facilitate this.


